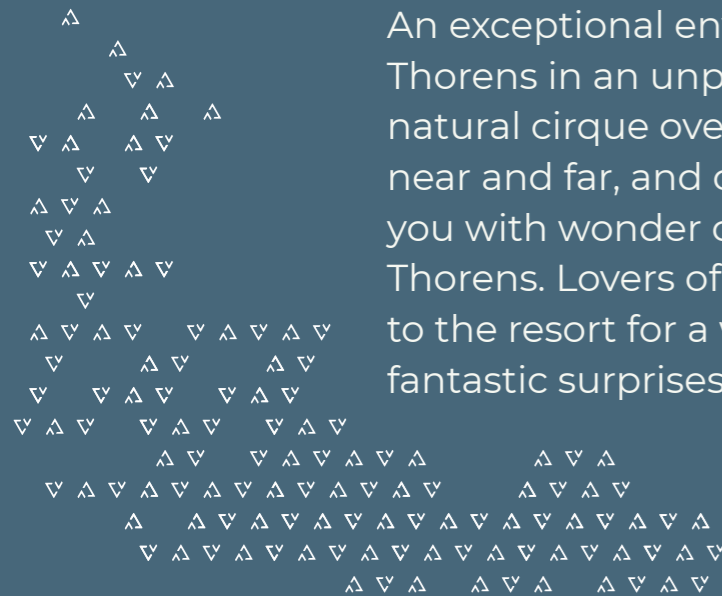

GETTING HERE, GETTING AROUND AND PARKING

BY AIR

Val Thorens enjoys a central location, around two hours by car from four airports:

- Geneva Cointrin Airport
- Grenoble Airport
- Chambéry Savoie Mont-Blanc Airport
- Lyon Saint-Exupéry Airport

Many transfer options are available between the airport and the resort. Val Thorens is also home to a helipad that can accommodate several helicopters at once.

BY TRAIN

37 kilometres away, Moûtiers is the closest train station to Val Thorens. From the train station, you can take a taxi or an Altibus group shuttlebus. Transfers run frequently and are scheduled to coincide with train timetables.

BY CAR

To get to Val Thorens, take the motorway to Albertville, then follow the Route Nationale A road as far as Moûtiers. From there, it's just a few kilometres to the resort. Between November 1st and March 31st, all vehicles coming into the resort must be equipped with snow tyres or snow chains.

- Geneva : 200 km
- Lyon : 250 km
- Paris : 700 km
- Grenoble : 150 km
- Chambéry : 110 km

SHUTTLEBUSES

Free shuttlebuses provide a very frequent daily bus service between 8am and 8pm. The main line offers an easy way to get around all of Val Thorens' major sectors. The inter-resort shuttlebuses will take you to Les Ménuires and Saint-Martin de Belleville by road.

PARKING IN VAL THORENS

VAL THORENS CAR PARK LOCATIONS AND RATES:

Val Thorens is a semi-pedestrianised resort, and cars are not allowed on many of the roads. Car parks are provided to make life easy from the moment you arrive, and throughout your stay.

There are three covered car parks in Val Thorens. P0, P1 and P2 are located inside the resort.

— P0 covered car park: *130 rue de la Boucle*
85€ for 7 nights

— P1 covered car park: *656 Grand Rue*
85€ for 7 nights

— P2 covered car park: *10 rue du Soleil*
85€ for 7 nights

P3 and P4 are open air car parks located outside the semi-pedestrianised village.

We recommend that you book a parking space in advance. Bookings should be made 7 days before your arrival date at the latest.

WHAT ABOUT ELECTRIC CARS?

In every covered car park, six electric charge points are available to use.
